o Askin	Risk Level 4 In g questions in stage 3 helps us know what invitations to offer and how to offer them (John 1:46) The stages don't have to be in sequential order to be effective. You can skip stages 1-3 and go straight to tage 4 if you want! Can invite to worship, to listen to sermons on the website, to Visitor Sunday and potluck, to House to louse, to a Bible study, to read a tract, to pray, etc. If we're afraid of risking rejection, this is where faith becomes real! Be and courageous, knowing God is with you!
